## **11. Introducing Bolton's Complex Safeguarding Team (CST)**

This is a briefing session for all staff who deal with cases of exploitation in its many forms and make referrals for a service. The "EXIT" team in Bolton (Child Sexual Exploitation Team) has undergone a significant change in their role and together with 2 specialist GMP police teams and additional support from key partner agencies make up the newly formed Complex Safeguarding Team. This briefing aims to provide staff with an understanding of the changes made, what the new model looks like and how it will operate. This will include discussion about the new referral pathway, thresholds, resources and the different level of support offer to young people, their families and partner agencies.

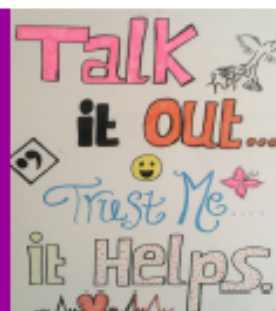

## Children and Young People's Service

If abuse is happening in your home, you may feel unsafe, scared or anxious. If you can't go to school and you're being told you can't leave the house, you may be worried you have no one to talk to. It is really important you know how to keep yourself safe from domestic abuse and we are here to help you through telephone, text, email and video.



### How can we help you?

If you are struggling with the effects of domestic abuse, our specialist Children and Young People's workers can help you with:

- 1 to 1 support and advice
- Managing your emotions
- Personal safety plans and risk assessments to keep you safe in your home
- A safe arena to explore healthy and unhealthy relationships

### What should I do if I feel unsafe in my home?

**Trusted adults:** If adults are hurting each other, pick a trusted adult you can talk to. This could be a neighbour, an auntie or uncle, a teacher or a friend's parent. Remember to pick an adult who you can ring or contact easily and keep their number safe.

**Safe place:** Find a place to keep yourself safe away from where arguments or conflict is happening. If you have younger siblings try to take them with you. Never get involved if adults are hurting each other, even if you want to - you must keep yourself safe. If you can, leave your house and go and ask a neighbour for help. It's OK to do this even whilst we are in lockdown.

**Emergency:** If it is an emergency, you can ring 999 - this is a free call from any phone and you do not need to know the phone's passcode. If it is not safe to speak, press 55 when prompted.

### Advice for professionals

If you are a professional currently working with a child or young person suffering the effects of domestic abuse, we are still taking referrals into the service and are available for general advice. We are also doing remote sessions for children and young people at home and, where possible, in schools so they have a safe zone to a talk.
